Septic System Maintenance

Maintaining your septic system is extremely important for maximizing the life of the system and for safeguarding you and your family from disease-causing organisms. Properly working systems are essential for protecting surface, ground and drinking water supplies.

- 1. Pump out the septic tank or aerator every 3–5 years or when the sludge level is at 1/3 of the capacity.
- 2. The aerator motor should run continuously.
- 3. Switch leach fields every six months if there is a "D" box and periodically clean the filter in the septic tank.
- 4. Do not use your septic system as a trash can. Never flush hazardous chemicals, medications, garbage, or tank additives.
- 5. Limit garbage disposal usage.
- 6. Practice water conservation and spread out laundry loads over the week. Use low-flow fixtures and repair leaky faucets and running toilets immediately. Do not plumb the water softener backwash into the system.
- 7. Never drive over, dig in, or plant on top of the septic system.
- 8. Plan ahead for future septic repairs and keep an area on your property vacant for replacement of the system if needed.
- 9. Contact the Health Department if you experience any problems with your system
